Each week of camp includes breakfast snack, lunch and afternoon snack and a week's worth of fantastic, exciting activities! Camp time is from 8:30 am to 4:30pm. Camp tuition also includes all required materials for the week, as well as transportation and admission to the week's field trip. All of this for only \$195!

Week 1: Fizzle, Bubble, Pop: June 6<sup>th</sup> – June 10<sup>th</sup>

We have an AMAZING week of AWESOME experiences waiting for your k-2nd grader!

From exploding soda, making film canisters pop, creating magic touch bags and making and playing with flubber and ooblick! We will be lifting ice and making our very own pints of ice cream!

Week 2 + 3: The 7 Wonders of the Ancient World – June 13<sup>th</sup> – June 17<sup>th</sup> / June 20<sup>th</sup> – June 24<sup>th</sup>

Come along as we use simple machines to see how the ancients built amazing masterpieces. Recreate the Hanging Gardens of Babylon by utilizing pulleys to bring water to the top floors, use magnifying glasses to explore how the ancient people of Alexandria defended themselves with lasers to burn enemy ships and use ramps and wedges to build a pyramid using Imhotep's ancient design

Week 4: That's not MY MUMMY! \_June 27<sup>th</sup>- July 1<sup>st</sup>

Explore ancient Egypt as a Chief Priest in the temple of Ra while overseeing the mummification of the pharaoh, look over Imhotep's plans for his latest creation, the one that he calls the Sphinx and discover the ancient city of Petra . This week culminates in an incredible day spent at the Michael Carlos Museum at Emory University exploring various sarcophagi, koptoc jars and funeral items.

Week 5: It's our BIRTHDAY America!: July 5 – July 8

Why is America like no other place in the world? Why does our country flourish while others struggle? Why did America start? Why do we celebrate with fireworks? Learn the secrets of the Statue of Liberty, Mount Rushmore and Philadelphia as our first capital! Enjoy cake and sparklers as we celebrate this wonderful country of ours!

Week 6: **If you could, would you live under the sea?** July 11- July 15

Can you really ride on the back of a Manta Ray? Are all Jellyfish the stinging type of Jellyfish? Can sharks live in cold and warm water? Can all sharks hurt you? What really happens when a ship sinks? We will explore the largest portion of the earth that has been left unexplored and culminate our study with a trip to the Georgia Aquarium, complete with a special, behind the scene tour. We will explore the relationships between people and sharks, dispelling myths and providing a better understanding of one of the most misunderstood animals on earth. Our students will explore real shark fossils, a collection of jaws and teeth, full-size cast models from real specimens, authentic artifacts from the movie Jaws and more. We will also view an amazing "frozen in time" display featuring a real, frozen 700-lb Bluefin tuna and its natural predator, a real frozen Mako shark.

Week7: **If you dig, you will find it!** July 18-July 22

In 70 A.D. a group of people left their home in a big hurry. What did they leave behind? What can you tell about their lives by what you find? How do archaeologists find great stuff? What happens once they find it? Excavate a Native American pottery site at the school and practice your excavation skills and travel with us to LaGrange where we will excavate for dinosaur bones and try to learn what did happen to the ancient city and families of Capernicum. This week culminates with a field trip to the Center for Historical Studies in LaGrange.

Week 8: **Australia: The land of Aborigines and Astronomy** July 25 – July 29

What constellations can you see in the night sky if you are laying on Ayers Rock:~ Does Australia hold more than simple Kangaroos? Explore this land of mystery and our own night sky, as we tell the stories of the same stars that shine in both the United States as well as Australian. We will complete our study of the night sky by meeting at the Fernbank Planetarium for a nighttime fieldtrip!
